Talk to Your Healthcare Team

Before heading into summer plans, check in with your epilepsy doctor or nurse. They can help you make informed choices and adjust your seizure action plan if needed.



Share Your Plans

Let loved ones know your summer activities and invite them to join you. Having support around makes a big difference!



Inform Others

If you're attending camp, traveling, or playing sports, make sure lifeguards, counselors, coaches, and guides are aware of your epilepsy and seizure action plan.



Stay Hydrated

Dehydration can trigger seizures. Drink water consistently, especially in the heat and during activity.



Eat Well

Fuel your body with balanced meals and healthy snacks, especially if you'll be out for long stretches.



Take Medications as Prescribed

Stick to your medication routine. Use reminders or apps to help if your schedule changes over summer.



Prioritize Sleep

Poor sleep is a common trigger. Keep a regular sleep schedule and rest up before intense activity.



Use Protective Gear

Don't forget your bike helmet, life jacket, or any safety gear relevant to your activities



Be Water Smart

Never swim alone. Make sure someone nearby knows what your seizures look like and how to help.



Be Cautious When Alone

Going for a solo hike, jog, or bike ride? Share your route and return time with someone you trust.



Carry Medical ID

Wear or carry something that identifies your epilepsy and includes your seizure action plan, like a bracelet, wallet card, or medical ID app.

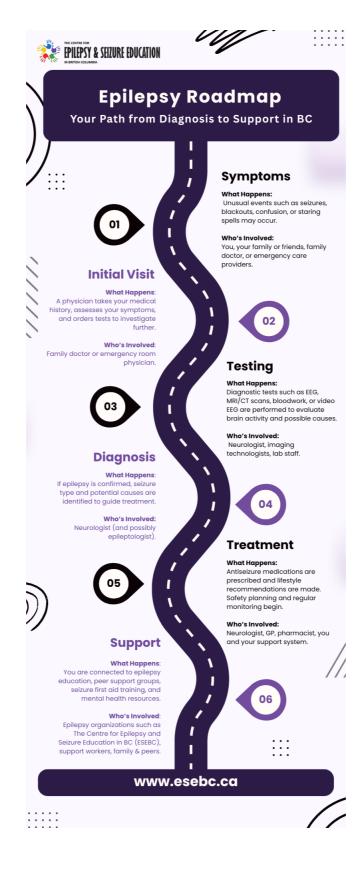
