Medications & Health

- Take your medicines on time and keep a backup, if
- Make sure your seizure action plan is up to date.



Talk & Share

- Let your teachers, coaches, school staff, and friends know about your epilepsy
- Keep a list of emergency contacts handy



School & Learning

- Ask for any extra support you might need (like extra time for tests or notes)
- Set reminders for homework and medications
- Take short breaks if you feel tired or unwell



Healthy Habits

- Get enough sleep each night
- · Eat regular, balanced meals and drink water
- Practice ways to relax and reduce stress



Friends & Fun

- Tell friends how they can help during a seizure
- Join activities you enjoy safely

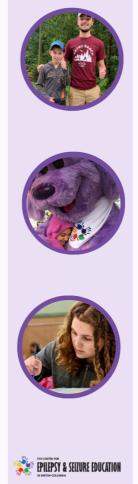

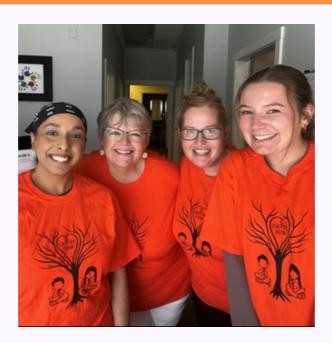
Meet Denise, Our New Volunteer

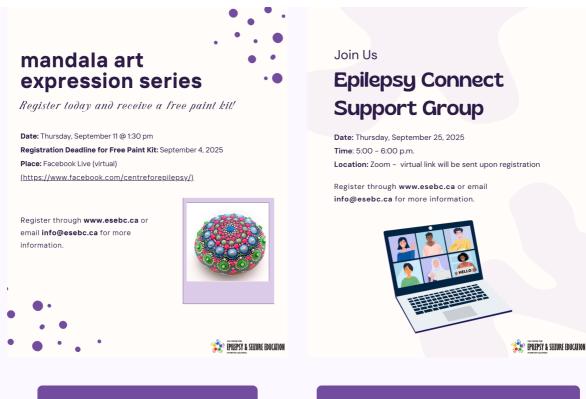
Honouring Truth and Reconcilliation Day
